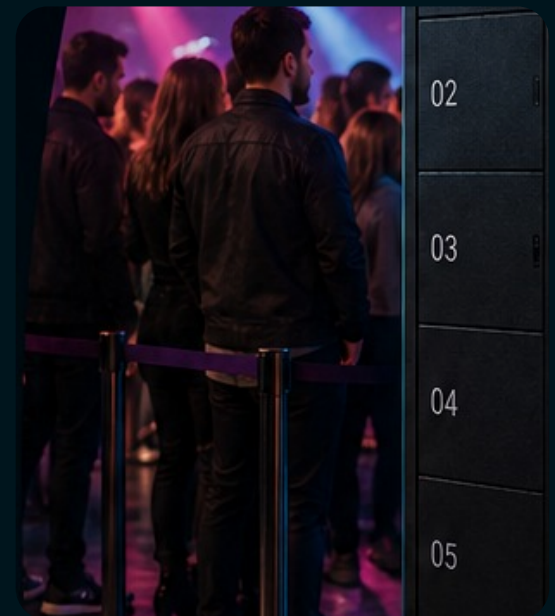

Why Cloakroom Queues Form

Nightclub congestion grows when large groups arrive, store belongings and leave within the same narrow time windows.

A manual cloakroom turns every handover into a queue point.



The Main Causes

A

Batch Arrivals

Large groups arrive together, creating immediate pressure on entrance and storage areas.

H

Manual Handovers

Every coat or bag requires direct staff involvement at drop-off and collection.

C

Unclear Capacity

Without live availability, teams cannot redirect guests or manage storage demand before queues build.

E

Exit Surges

At closing time, many guests want their belongings at once, creating a second major queue.

22

22:30 Arrivals Accelerate

Security checks, ticket scans and coat storage happen at the same time, concentrating demand near the entrance.

23

23:00 Storage Demand Peaks

Staff must receive items, issue tickets, find storage space and repeat the process for every guest.

02

02:00 Large Exit Wave

Hundreds of guests may decide to leave within the same short period.

02:15 Collection Queue Grows

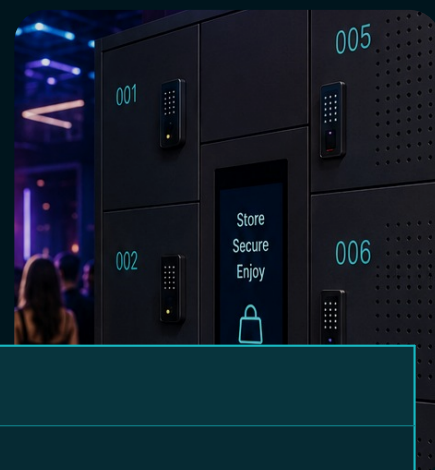
Without live availability or self-service collection, staff must locate and return each item individually.

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Although each delay may only last a minute or two, together they create unnecessary congestion across the venue.

The Hidden Cost of Cloakroom Congestion

Queues affect staffing, safety, bar spend, reviews and the final impression guests take away from the venue.



Peak-Time Issue	Operational Impact
Long cloakroom queues	Crowding near entrances, exits and circulation routes
Manual ticket handling	More staff required during narrow peak windows
Slow item retrieval	Guests leave frustrated after an otherwise positive night
Lost or damaged tickets	Disputes, delays and manager involvement
No live capacity view	Late decisions and poor use of storage space
Guests queueing instead of buying	Less time at bars and lower spending opportunities

Key Takeaway

A cloakroom can become a bottleneck twice in one night: once when guests arrive and again when they leave.

Better storage flow protects both the guest experience and commercial performance.

How CrowdStor Smart Lockers Improve Flow

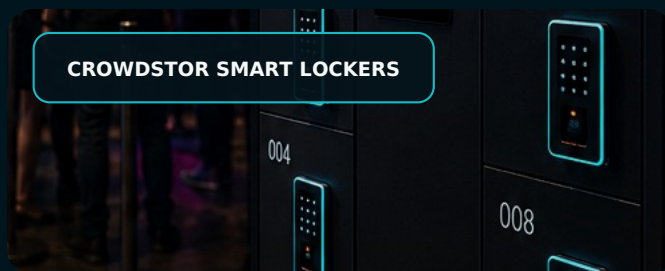
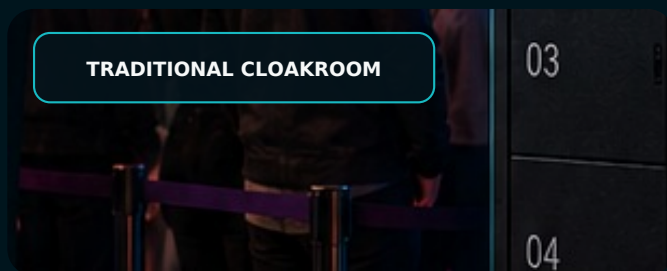
Operational Benefits

- ✓ Guests queue to drop off coats
- ✓ Collection creates a second queue at closing
- ✓ Lost tickets require manager intervention
- ✓ Teams cannot see live capacity
- ✓ Staffing rises sharply during peak periods
- ✓ Self-service could remove repetitive handovers
